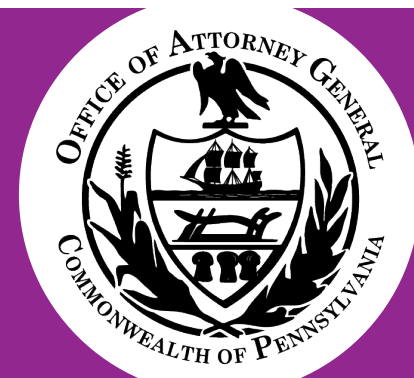

The best way to avoid being scammed is by slowing down and verifying that requests for information or money are legitimate. Taking a few extra minutes to confirm who you are dealing with can help protect your finances, identity, and peace of mind.

REMEMBER TO:



Stop and think before you act.

Don't let emotions, demands, or external pressure rush you to action.



Verify unexpected calls, emails, direct messages, or texts.

Contact the person or organization directly using a phone number or website you know is legitimate.



Talk to people you trust.

Scammers often rely on secrecy to maintain control and avoid potential scrutiny.



Don't click on links received in pop-up ads or alerts.

Clicking on these links may allow scammers to access sensitive information or lead to fake websites designed to steal information.



Research unfamiliar charities, businesses, offers, and investment opportunities.

Check with a trusted friend, family member, or financial advisor.



Never give personal information to callers.

This includes Social Security numbers, banking information, and Medicare numbers.



Be cautious of requests for gift cards, wire transfers, cryptocurrency, or payment apps.

Legitimate organizations rarely request payment this way.



Be wary of prize and sweepstakes claims.

You should never have to pay a fee to collect a legitimate prize.
